

Poverty levels in Africa have increased astronomically in the 21st Century regardless of efforts of African governments to tackle the issues of economic and social deprivation arising out of extreme poverty. In the rural areas of Africa the issue of poverty is even too alarming and unbearable. Studies have indicated that. the income levels are extremely low with its attendant poor standard of living due to illiteracy, remoteness, lack of infrastructure such as inaccessibility to schools and quality health care, poor drinking water among absence of other social comforts. It has therefore become vital for strategic development frameworks to deal with

this ever-growing canker impoverishing the poorest of the poor in the rural areas of Africa.

We believe that any strategy earmarked for the eradication of extreme poverty must inherently equip the rural folks with skills training and nurturing of talents which will be the source of their livelihood. To achieve these goals we believe nurturing the children through basic education will build them to become self-reliant in the future.

This year LEAF started more child sponsorship programs which had to have given a "U turn" to many children for a better future. LEAF is sponsoring children who had no hope in continuing their basic education.

Priscilla

Priscilla Dansoa Amoah was born on 22nd April 2011 while her mother was a teenager. In Ghana, teenage pregnancy is too rampant among the rural folks. The mother of Priscilla



was also a complete orphan so she was staying with other relatives of their extended family. You can imagine how the care and protection of Priscilla will be. Her future career is to be a nurse or a professional teacher. Even at her age she sometimes gathers children below her age and teaches them Bible stories. Priscilla's future was uncertain due to her background situation until we picked her to be sponsored by the LEAF program. The program renders free education and supplies food stuffs. She always says I'm blessed.

Michael Gamawo

Michael Gamawo is a 9-yrold boy in stage 3 in Ankaful M/A basic school in Cape Coast metropolis Ghana-West Africa. His mother Akosua Konadu is a petty trader, because the mother is a single parent she is not able to cater for the child as it should be.

The child lacks basic needs like security and school materials to the extent that the mother can't afford three square meals a day for the child.

Michael is brilliant academically and intelligent but needy, Thanks to Lighthouse Ministries International for your love, kindness and blessing to Michael to be part of the LEAF program.
