If you say, "The Lord is my refuge," and you make the Most High your dwelling, no harm will overtake you, no disaster will come near your tent. For he will command his angels concerning you to guard you in all your ways. Psalm 91:9-11

Haiti has a long history of changing governments and political unrest, but in the last year violence has erupted across the country. Most schools are closed, some police stations have been burned, well-established businesses in Port-au-Prince are downsizing or closing, many missions and NGOs have left the country, and there is still no end in sight.

Most news outlets report the manifestations as a popular protest to oust a corrupt president, but the reality is quite a bit more complicated. I don't make any claims of being an expert on Haiti or its history, but I'm going to give you my perspective on what's happening and what we're facing here in Haiti.

Most Haitians seem to agree that our President, Jovenel Moise, should re-sign. It is also common knowledge that many of these protests are funded by some of the biggest business men in Haiti. It all seems to come down to a very lucrative government contract that Jovenel did not want to renew. I personally don't believe that our president is 'corrupt,' at least not any more corrupt than the rest of the government. Any way that you tell/hear the story it comes down to a standoff between Jovenel and the opposition in the government. Jovenel refuses to step down, and the opposition has spent too much money on protests to back down now...so we're left with a collapsing infrastructure and gangs taking advantage of the chaos to rob and steal (often with violence).

Life is difficult for everyone here.

We can't go about 'normal' life. The country is in 'lock down.' It occasionally opens up

for a few days at a time and we restock on supplies, but the violence keeps increasing. Life is unpredictable—no one knows what the future holds. and no one seems to be able to come up with a suitable compromise that could bring everyone together. Everyone is suffering. People in the mountains, people in our little town, and all over Haiti. People are hungry, they're using up the last of their savings and they'll have to start all over again with their businesses when this is finally over. Electricity is usually off right now and most of the time we have a porch full of people charging their phones. Fuel for vehicles and generators isn't always available either. We fill up everything whenever our gas station has fuel. Prices are going up for everything. Our students can't pay for classes and I have a feeling that many people are surviving on money sent here by their family in other countries. We're all hoping something changes soon and trusting God to provide.

We here at Redeemed Vocational School feel 'safe' in our little town. We're still having classes although the schedule tends to be unpredictable for the classes that have teachers from Port-au-Prince. In many ways our life has slowed down from its normally hectic pace. We stay home unless we can make it in to Port-au-Prince for supplies whenever it opens up long enough to give everyone a chance to breathe a bit. So far we have everything we need.

God is good and we trust him to carry us through this storm.

Building Project

Building Project Current Status

- LHCH owns a 7 acres suitable for building the Home.
- Architectural drawing are complete.
- Site is leveled to grade.
- Project supervisor has been retained and contractor hired.
- Foundation and floor have been completed & paid for.



Points to Consider

- Ghana has competent building contractors and materials.
- The country best benefits from outside help in the form of funding to hire local workers that need employment.
- LMI Board is comfortable that a high-quality facility will be constructed by the local resources.
- Building project is currently proceeding with funds on hand.

Funding Requirements

- LMI has funding sources via monthly commitments and fundraisers etc. to meet ongoing operational expenses.
- This is a one-time capital raise for the purpose of getting this project to the stage that it can be inhabited by the Children's Home.
- Total project cost: 250,000 CAD. Current shortfall: 150,000 CAD.

Building Goals & Timeline

- LHCH is currently renting. Rent renewal is next spring (2 years prepaid).
- Rent cost: approx 25,000 CAD.
- If the building can be completed, the renting treadmill can be stopped.
