Today we live in Haiti. todav we have a ministry that God gave us, and today God protected us and our loved ones. Today, by the grace of God, Redeemed Vocational School is still thriving and classes continue as if we live in a safe country. We have so much to thank God for as we await the promised peace and deliverance of the return of Jesus!

Politically, all the people appointed by President Jovnel have been forced out of the government and the 'opposition' is in power once again. This whole security catastrophe was caused by a power struggle in the government for who controls the government contracts. There's a surprising amount of money - literally billions- that could provide all the infrastructure Haiti needs if it were used for this country instead of lining the pockets of a few of the rich and powerful.

It enabled me to give undivided attention and focus to my studies and issues that were consequential to my success. I was able to purchase the tools, instruments, components and materials I needed for my practicals and project works. This gave me a better understanding of the relationship between electrical and electronic engineering and how they can be fused to solve technological problems in our contemporary world.

Additionally, I was able to attend all the educational trips organized by my department to enrich our understanding of the concepts and theories we studied in class. In one of those trips, we visited Aboadze Thermal Plant: an electrical power generating station in the western region of Ghana and there we had the opportunity to visit their control room. It was very intriguing to see how the entire plant was being managed by a SCADA system, so I developed interest for industrial automation and control course in the future. These experiences were very helpful to me, they enabled me to excel in my academic work. Thus, I graduated as one of the best students in my year group.
